Library Plans Now Complete, Ready for Move



Last Heavily Populated Area Asks Incorporation

Another speedy action to escape annexation possibilities by the City of Farmington and/or leave the township took place over the week end, and Monday morning petitions were filed at Pontica asking a vote on incorporation of the City of Clarenceville.

This is the little over four square miles in the southeast portion of the township left: last week when similar petitions were filed for most of the north and east portion of the township as the City of Farmington Woods. There were 484 names on the petitions filed by Judge Allen C. Ingle.

The proposed city includes all of sections 35 and 36, the major portions of sections 26 and 34, and the east half of section 25, all east of the city of Farmington. There's more than 2,000 people involved, to comply with regulations an area must have an average of 500 per square mile to incorporate as a city.

MOST OF THE Township is now "tied down" against any other moves, and must await outcome of votes in the four areas involved. Dates for voting on these last two requests will be set in about a month by the county bound of supervisors, after review and recommendations by the county boundaries committee.

Workers in both Clareneeville and Farmington Woods frankly told their citizens this was a move to forestall possible annexation by the City of Farmington. Farmington City people were reported to have been circulating annexation petitions in the Clareneeville area just prior to the sudden action by the group which filed their own petitions Monday.

VOTING On two other changes, annexation of the southwest area to the City of Farmington, and formation of Quakertown Village, will be balloted on by these citizens Aug. 5, simultaneously with the primary election.

It's likely, but not certain, another date will be chosen for the Clarenceville and Farmington Woods elections. A practical reason is that only so many additional propositions can easily be voted with voting machines at a primary election.
