Imagine the election of the President of the United States being conducted in secret session of the U.S. Senate - with all the rest of the nation denied the right to know even the identity of the nominees. Well, this is precisely the manner in which the 3.2 million - member Episcopal Church will fill its top post of presiding bishop next month at its general convention meeting in Louisville. This outrageous example of nonsensical ecclesiastical arrogance - in which only the bishops are allowed to know the identity of the nominees until after they elect - is a rule of the House of Bishops. Bishop Robert Gibson of Richmond, Va., chairman of the nominating committee and vice chairman of the House, has lamented: "When you ask for public suggestions, the public expects a report back." Such clandestine assemblies as concealed nominees simply serves to stimulate furious speculation. This column has already received written claims that among the secret nominees are: •Bishop Robert Spears of Rochester, N.Y., nominated as a reward for having con-

tributed \$750,000 (from a multi-million dollar diocesan legacy) to the financially impoverished national Episcopal headquarters. •Bishop John Allyn of Mississippi - because he has been successfully promoted throughout the entire nation by an ultra-charming Mississippi plantation owner named Oscar Carr, who is serving as the denomination's development officer. •Bishop John Burt of Cleveland - because as a red-hot liberal he has helped fund both black and Indian militants and because he is in control of the clergy deployment (employment) computer system, which recently helped produce a new bishop for Erie, Pa. This column is happy to offend suggestions which can end all this idle speculation (and underground campaigning) - and save at least \$100,000 as well.
