

C'ville Cuts Operating Rate

Operating millage in the Clarenceville School District will be reduced by 0.39 mills, or about 1.1 per cent, in December tax bills.

For the average homeowner, it may mean a saving of \$7 to \$8, assuming his property valuation remains the same.

In the Livonia portion of the district, however, the total tax bill will rise a little because of a four per cent increase in the state equalization factor. That factor is the amount applied against all assessments so that all property statewide is assessed at 50 per cent of true cash value.

In the Farmington Hills sector, the SEV factor remains the same, so the cut in the tax rate will have its greatest impact there.

In the Redford Township portion of Clarenceville, the equalization factor was increased by nearly four per cent, so the effect will be much the same as in Livonia — a slight rise in Clarenceville tax bills.

The Clarenceville board of Education approved the new millage reduction last week after an "executive" (closed door secret) session that lasted about 20 minutes.

"This will reduce our operating millage to 33.5 mills," said Raymond Chaiken, board member. We will have a budget based on that tax rate.

Debt retirement millage amounts to 7.01 mills for the next school year for a total of 33.5 mills.

"Our budget is based on realistic costs," said Supt. Dave McDowell. "If we are in the red, then our fund equity will be reduced by that amount."

Although the millage reduction will mean a loss of about \$28,000 in revenue for the district, McDowell said the deficit this year could run as high as \$50,000 to \$60,000.

"The deficit is conceivable because employees take 60 per cent of our budget. We promised no cuts or reduction in services, but we have reserved \$25,000 in the budget. If we win, then we can balance the budget."

Business Manager E.J. Saliz predicted the "school district will go into deficit if they win the appeal, we have to go back three years to pay back some taxes," Saliz said. "We have promised for this something, but we have reserved \$25,000 in the budget. If we win, then we can balance the budget."

There is a brighter side to the picture. "We will receive more revenue locally," Saliz commented.
