

ACE to Hear Talk on Education In USSR; M. Zielke Will Preside

The Association for Child Education will have its opening dinner meeting of the 1958-1959 year at the Kipbalt High School in Royal Oak at 6:15 tonight, Thursday, November 20.

Miss Minnie Zielke, director of elementary education in Farmington public schools, as president will preside over an assembly of well over 300 educators and parents interested in the elementary school age child.

The main speaker for the evening will be Dr. Marion Edman, professor of education at Wayne State University. This past summer Dr. Edman toured Russia, visiting elementary schools and talking with school administrators and teachers.

Dr. Edman's topic, which will center in this trip to the U.S.S.R. will be "Early Child Education in Russia."

Dr. Edman has worked extensively abroad while in the absence from the university. In 1944-45 she worked with the Bureau of International Education. In 1946-50 she worked with the military government in Bavaria on re-orientation programs. And in 1955-57 Dr. Edman served as a consultant in teacher education in Lebanon and Vietnam.

With this kind of background, Dr. Edman should prove a valuable and interesting speaker for this group of parents and educators.

Timely Tips on GARDENING

WINTER PREPARATIONS Farmington gardeners have never been able to continue their garden activities well into November, which the labels have been because of unusually mild, drier weather. Soon, however, the garden should be prepared for winter, although thorough soaking before the planting of trees and shrubs, ground freezes. Then drain and tulip and lily bulbs can be stored in a cool place and will be cooled slowly and hang over two weeks on the garage wall.

Hybrid Tea roses should be pruned in late November. Cut them back to about 24 inches high if mounted at least 10 inches high in the ground. It is too soon to apply any mulches to perennial beds or lawns. Wait until the ground is completely frozen. The purple-leafed, do not start growth until late in the Spring, and it keeps the ground frozen during winter. Also take up any alternate freezing and thawing which may push plants out of the ground exposing the roots.
