Varied Book Collection Display Slated Jan. 5-9

A collection of 600 new and recent books in a representative exhibit covering all ages will be on display January 5 at the elementary school at Oring and Bond elementary school at Orchard Lake and 13 Mile Road. The exhibit is a collection of books that extend children's horizons, stimulate their minds, and imaginations and develop their perception and appreciation. In short it is a collection of books which educators so highly prize and which are basic to the whole teaching-learning process. The exhibit will be open daily from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. and will last through January 9.

A FEATURE of the exhibit is an annotated, graded, indexed catalogue, which lists by grade every book in the collection, and which is available for free distribution to teachers, librarians, and other school people. By numbering the books and the catalogue correspondingly, providing complete subject and author indexes, the exhibit's 600 books are, in terms of any interest, made directly accessible.

The 31 subjects involved in the collection range from arts and biography to science and religion; from adventure and aerodynamics to picture books and social studies. The fiction region is divided into no fewer than 15 sub-categories.

THE EXHIBIT comes here from, and is sponsored by "Books On Exhibit," a national service operation involving the country's leading publishers of children's books. Its purpose is to provide organized exhibit and complete covering catalogue, to provide busy teachers and librarians with an opportunity to see and examine the best of the new library books, with a minimum expenditure of time and effort, and thus make it possible for them to do an informed and intelligent job of book selection.

BUT the general public, and particularly parents, will also find the exhibit of absorbing interest and are urged to see it. No books are sold, incidentally, since "Books On Exhibit," a strictly promotional operation, neither accepts nor forges orders. The exhibit comes to being brought here through Dr. Harry Hahn, Director of the Oakland County Reading Clinic, and has been arranged by Miss Minnie Ziegle, Director of elementary education for the Farmington schools.

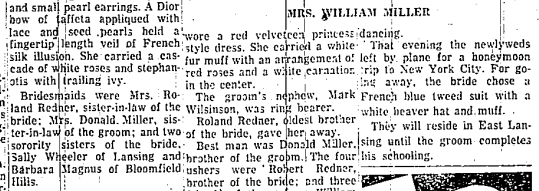
