

REGISTRATION NOTICE

For GENERAL PRIMARY ELECTION

Monday, February 16, 1959

To the Qualified Electors of the City of Farmington, COUNTY OF OAKLAND, STATE OF MICHIGAN

Notice is hereby given that in conformity with the Michigan Election Code, Chapter 1, the day of any regular or special election or primary election, receive for registration the name of any legal voter who may APPLY TO ME PERSONALLY for such registration.

ON January 19, 1959 - Last Day

The Thirtieth day preceding said Election

As provided by Section 1, Chapter 1, Part 2 (a), Act No. 380 of the Public Acts of 1947, amended by Act No. 291, Public Acts of 1949 and Act No. 108, Public Acts of 1951.

From 8 o'clock a.m. until 8 o'clock p.m. on each said day for the purpose of REVIEWING THE REGISTRATION and REGISTERING on the qualified electors in said CITY as SHALL PROPERLY apply therefor.

The name of no person but an ACTUAL RESIDENT of the precinct at the time of registration, and entitled under the constitution, to remain such resident, shall be entered in the registration book.

ELECTOR UNABLE TO MAKE PERSONAL APPLICATION. Any elector who is unable to make personal application for registration because of physical disability or absence from the Township, City or Village in which his legal residence is located, may be registered prior to the close of registration before any election or primary election by securing from the Clerk of the Township, City or Village in which he is located a notary public, duplicate registration cards and executing in duplicate the registration affidavit before a notary public or other officer legally authorized to administer oaths and return the said registration cards to the Clerk of the Township, City or Village before the close of office hours on the last day of registration prior to the election or primary election.

SEC. 1. The inspectors of the ELECTION DAY, UNREGISTERED PERSONS NOT ENTITLED TO VOTE. No person who is not registered in the registration book of the precinct in which he offers to vote. (As provided under Act 108, P. A. 1951).

TRANSFER OF REGISTRATION. Any registered elector may upon change of residence within the Township, City or Village cause his registration to be transferred to his new address by sending the Clerk a signed request, stating his present address, the date he moved there, and the address from which he was last registered, or by applying in person for a transfer. The Clerk shall strike through the last address, ward and precinct number and record the new address, ward and precinct number on the original and duplicate registration cards, and shall place the original registration card in proper precinct file. Such transfers shall not be made within the (30) days next preceding any election or primary election, (unless such transfers shall fall on a Saturday, Sunday or legal holiday in which event registration shall be accepted during the next full working day) provided that no such transfer shall permit any person to vote in any Township, City or Village in which he has not resided (30) days next preceding any election or primary election.

TRANSFER OF REGISTRATION ON ELECTION DAY. Any registered elector who has removed from one election precinct of a Township, City or Village to another election precinct in the same Township, City or Village shall have the right to make application to have his registration transferred on any election or primary election day by executing a request over his or her signature for such transfer and presenting the same to the election board in the precinct in which he is registered. Upon receiving such request the Inspector in charge of the registration records shall compare the signature thereon with the signature upon the applicant's registration record and if the signatures correspond then the Inspector shall certify such fact upon said registration record and the applicant for transfer shall be permitted to vote in such precinct for that election only. The application for transfer shall be filed with the Township, City or Village Clerk who shall transfer the registration record in accordance with the application. When the name of any street in a Township, City or Village has been changed, it shall be the duty of the Township, City or Village Clerk to make the change to show the proper name of street in the registration records, and it shall not be necessary for the elector to change his registration with respect thereto in order to be eligible to vote. When the resident house numbers of any section of a Township, City or Village have been changed, such a change shall not affect the right of such voter to cast his vote. Corresponding changes in the registration record may be made by the Clerk or upon election day upon proper showing.
