

Falcons Continue to Show Improvement

Avenge Earlier Defeat Against Walled Lake Vikings on Friday

Concrete proof of the Farmington Falcon cage team's remarkable improvement since the first of the season was given last Friday night.

In a re-match with the Walled Lake Vikings, the Farmington quintet chalked up a 33-45 victory for their fourth win in their last five contests. The win avenged a 78-90 defeat handed the Falcons by the Vikings in their opening league game of the season in December.

The Falcons will be out to "do it again" this Friday night on their home court when they take on the Waterloo Skippers. This will be their second meeting with the Skippers and they will be looking to avenge a one-point loss handed them by the Skippers at their last meeting.

PREDICTED at the opening of the season to show little, the Falcons are now making a strong bid for second place in the Inter-Lakes League. Undeated Berkley appears certain to take undisputed championship honors.

The Falcons started fast against the Lakers Friday and by the end of the first period were in possession of a six-point 14-8 lead which they never relinquished.

Cawley Runs Well Against College Stars

Track season started for two Farmington Senior High runners, Rex Cawley and Mike Agnew, last Saturday, January 31 at the University of Michigan.

The meet was the annual AAU Indoor Championships in which both high school and college students participated.

Cawley, who is state champion in both high and low hurdles, took a fourth place in the 65 yard indoor college high hurdles finals in which the hurdles are three inches higher than the high school hurdles he is used to.

He failed to place in the low hurdles mostly due to a bad start in the semi-finals. Hayes, a junior at Eastern Michigan College, who has won track honors all over the world, and two University of Michigan men, including the Big Ten high hurdle champion, were the only men to beat Cawley in the high hurdle finals. The winning time was 8 seconds flat, which is a good time for this early in the season.

Although Agnew didn't place in his event, the 300 yard dash, he did turn in a good time and showed great promise for the forthcoming season.
