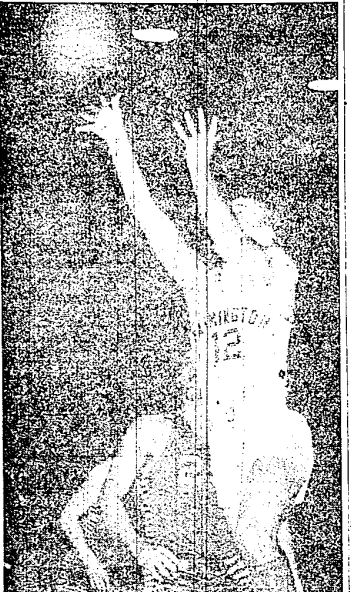


Falcons Avenge Another Loss



LEAVING HERE for a long shot while Waterford fans stand defeated is Bill Tom Grimshaw (12). This was an often repeated sight throughout the first half of play last Friday as Grimshaw went on a 20-point scoring spree in these two games.

Pint-sized Tom Grimshaw led the Farmington Falcons to their fourth league victory of the season last Friday night by racking up 22 points in their 76-52 victory over Waterford.

Farmington, who lost by one point to the Skippers in their previous meeting, had no fear of a repeat performance as they jumped to a 22-9 first quarter score with effective use of a full-court press. Several times the Skippers, rallied by the Falcons' close checking, threw the ball away.

The second period was a repeat of the first, Farmington attacking Waterford 21-14.

The halftime score was 33-23.

The difference, 20 points, was exactly what Grimshaw scored in a first half spree. Frank Chapman and Harvey Chapman both topped the list with seven points apiece.
