

To See Slides, Hear Talk on Atomic Power

"Atomic Power at Lagoona Beach" will be the title of a slide presentation to be given at the Monday, February 23, meeting of the Cloverdale Parent Teacher Association.

Robert Logue, electrical project engineer at Power Reactor Development Company, will be the speaker. He will discuss the company's part in the development and planning of the Enrico Fermi Atomic Power Plant near Monroe.

PRDC will own and operate reactor and steam generator from the fissioning of nuclear fuel to Detroit Edison for the production of electric power. Edison is building the conventional turbine-generator section of the plant.

Subject to Atomic Energy Commission approval, the Fermi plant is scheduled to be supplying 100,000 kilowatts of electricity for southeastern Michigan by early 1954.

Plans are already underway for a card party to be held March 21 at the Elk's Temple by the Vivians Club. Elk's wives organization.

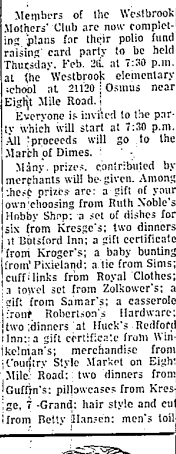
During their regular business meeting last Wednesday evening, Mrs. Dolores McLaughlin was introduced and welcomed to the membership.

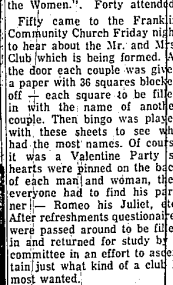
