Work to Start Soon on Swimming Club Pool

Construction of the pool and bath house for the new swimming club will be begun as soon as weather permits now that the club has reached its initial membership goal, an official spokesman for the club disclosed this week.
The club was organized last summer by a group of ten families in the Kendallwood area in an effort to provide supervised swimming facilities near their homes.



THE POOL will be located on 2 1/2 acre site east of Farmington Road between 12 and 13 Mile roads. Plans call for an Olympic sized pool, 42 feet wide by 82 feet deep and varying in depth from three to six feet. A diving ell off one deep corner will be 20 by 23 feet and 10 feet deep to accommodate three or three meter diving boards. The pool will be heated to provide a maximum number of swimming days for each week.

THIS IS NO time of year to be sitting around the house in bathing suits but these three women agreed to do their best to help publicize the Kendallwood Swimming Club. They are grouped around a poster giving the names of members of the board of directors and committee heads. At the bottom of the poster is a picture of the site on which the club's pool will be built this summer and an architect's rendering of the pool area.

Turnpike Authority Returning Funds to Highway Department

The Michigan Turnpike Authority has agreed to return all of its remaining funds totaling \$7,000 to the State Highway Department and has abandoned any "immediate efforts" to finance toll highways in Michigan.
The announcement was made jointly by George N. Higgins, chairman of the Authority, and State Highway Commissioner John C. Mackie.

"By resolution, the Turnpike Authority has agreed to end any immediate effort to finance toll roads and to return the balance of funds voted by its 1957 Legislature to the Highway Department," Higgins said.
The Highway Department's program would be meeting a different set of needs in Southeast Michigan - needs which must wait until after 1959.

The Authority was created by the Legislature in 1953 to create a toll road and to investigate the possibility of building toll roads, one from Toledo to Detroit and a second from Detroit to Chicago. An appropriation of \$500,000 was made.

Traffic cost estimates a preliminary engineering study and a traffic feasibility report were completed in 1955 on the Toledo-Bay City route. During the interim, the State Highway Department started construction of a 2 1/2-mile parallel expressway from the Ohio line to Rockwood. The report indicated feasibility for a toll road from Rockwood north to Saginaw. Shortly after a bond agreement was drafted by the Authority and financiers, the Highway Department announced plans for a toll-free Detroit-Bay City expressway which would serve the same route. The announced issuance of licenses to sell financial support for the toll road.

In 1957 an additional \$150,000 was appropriated to the Authority for the study.
Current members of the Authority are Higgins; Carl Smith Sr., Bay City attorney; Justin Whiting, Jackson, former Board Chairman; and James Porter, and Francis Van Antwerp Jr., Cheboygan, a marine engineer.

An opinion of the Attorney General in 1953 stated a county clerk's office could charge only \$2 for issuing a marriage license. The Oakland county resolution Jan. 8, 1954, added \$1 for issuance of an affidavit fee. In addition it ordered the county clerk to charge \$6 for issuance of licenses to out of state residents.

The Auditor General asked that this be ended.
In another connection to Oakland practices, the report noted that some members of the board of supervisors are serving on the county department of public works and get per diem compensation. Delos Hamlin of Farmington is chairman of this board.

The report noted this was in violation of a law which provides that no supervisor shall be employed in any capacity otherwise in the county government. It recommended that action be taken to correct the situation, and steps taken to secure reimbursement for such compensation already paid.

School Equipment
An expenditure of \$701.73 for miscellaneous items of equipment at various schools in the Farmington School District was approved by the School Board at its regular meeting Monday night. A major portion was for equipment at the Duncklee Junior High.

THE NAME of no person but an ACTUAL RESIDENT of interest in the time of registration, and entitled under the constitution, if remaining such resident, to vote at the next election, shall be entered in the registration book.

ELECTOR UNABLE TO MAKE PERSONAL APPLICATION, PROCEDURE
SEC. 504. Any elector who is unable to make personal application for registration because of physical disability or absence from the Township, City or Village in which his legal residence is located, may be registered prior to the close of registration before any election or primary election by securing from the Clerk of the Township, City or Village in which is located his legal residence, duplicate registration cards and executing in duplicate the registration affidavit before a notary public or other officer legally authorized to administer oaths and returning such registration cards to the Clerk of the Township, City or Village before the close of office hours on the last day of registration.

UNREGISTERED PERSONS NOT ENTITLED TO VOTE
SEC. 491. The inspectors of election at any election or primary election in this State, or in any District, County, Township, City or Village thereof, shall not receive the vote of any person whose name is not on the list of registered voters of the Township, Ward or Precinct in which he offers to vote. (As provided under Act 116, P.A. 1954.)

TRANSFER OF REGISTRATION; APPLICATION, TIME
SEC. 506. Any registered elector may upon change of residence within the Township, City or Village cause his registration to be transferred to his new address by sending to the Clerk a signed request, stating his present address, the date he moved thereto, and the address from which he was last registered, or the address from which he was last registered, and the address to which he is being transferred, and shall place the original registration card in proper precinct file. Such transfers shall not be made within the (30) days next preceding the date of the election, unless such transfers shall be made on a Saturday, Sunday or legal holiday in which event registration shall be accepted during the next full day of registration provided and designated shall permit any person to vote in any Township, City or Village in which he had not resided, (30) days next preceding any election or primary election.

TRANSFER OF REGISTRATION ON ELECTION DAY
SEC. 507. Any registered elector who has removed from one election precinct of a Township, City or Village to another election precinct of the same Township, City or Village shall be permitted to vote in such precinct on the day of the election if his registration transferred on any election or primary election day by executing a request over his or her signature for such transfer and presenting the same to the election inspectors in the precinct in which he is registered. Upon receiving such request the inspector of election in charge of the registration records shall compare such request with the registration records and if the elector's registration record and if the signatures correspond then the inspector shall certify such fact upon said request and the elector shall be permitted to vote in such precinct on the day of the election. The application for transfer shall be filed with the Township, City or Village Clerk who shall see that such voter's registration is transferred with the application. When the name of any street in a Township, City or Village has been changed, it shall be the duty of the Township, City or Village Clerk to make such changes in the proper name of street in the registration records, and if shall not be necessary for the elector to change his registration with respect thereto in order to be eligible to vote.
