Folder on Lawn Care Available

A free booklet on lawn care has been published by the Southern Association of Landscape Nurserymen. A limited quantity is available for the asking. The four-page pamphlet covers such subjects as soil, kind of seed, fertilizers and the best times to sow seed. It contains a warning against the use of rich-looking black mud (which is actually the byproduct of a tip on how to improve heavy clay soil).

In addition, there is a step-by-step outline of the recommended procedure in building a new lawn.

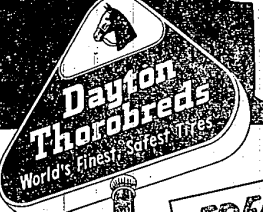
