A cock promodence over ordinary freight innovement lies been started in Michigan and surrounding states by live stock buyers and shipmens, which he based on the fact that the rati-tive stock buyers and shipments feel the brunt of the delays. The fift e-tablishes a minimum rate of speed for stock shipments of any 15 miles per bour while in Michigan territory. Sbippers claim the rationads made it a business to hold up stock in order to add freeding charges and then only furnish feed bough for a tenth of the number shipped.
