## Falcon Thinclads Win Easily Over Van Dyke

The Farmington Senior High track team defeated the Van Dyke thinclads in their second league meet of the season by the lopsided score of 74.33, Thursday, April 23.

Both the Falcon 880 yard relay team and the middle relay team topped the abates with times of 1:31.7 minutes and 2:51.2, respectively.

In the 880 yards relay each man runs 220 yards, while in the middle relay the first and last man 440 yards and the two middle men run 220 yards each.

Mike Agee won the 100 yard dash in 10.5 seconds, while in the 200 yard dash in 21 seconds flat. Tom Grimshaw took a second place in the 100 yard dash in 10.7 seconds.

The 150 yard high hurdles was won by Rex Cawley in 14.5, followed by Rudolph Van Dyke and Farmington's Tom Peckham.

Cawley also set a new broad jump record of 20' 7" and won the high jump at 5' 10", with Peckham taking second.
