**Kindergarten Registration Set May 6, 7**

Youngsters who will be starting kindergarten in the Farmington public schools in September will be registered next Tuesday and Wednesday, May 6 and 7, at the various elementary schools in the district.

Registration hours will be from 9:30 to 11:30 a.m. and 1:30 to 3:30 p.m. on Tuesday and from 9 to 8 p.m. on Wednesday.

Letters are now being sent out by principals at the elementary schools to the parents of some 800 children in the school district who will be five years old on or before December 1, 1959, and thus eligible to start school in the fall. Since the names of these children come from the May, 1958, census rolls, parents who have moved into the school district since that time will not receive letters. It was emphasized. They are urged to contact the principal of the elementary school in which the children live in their neighborhood are now attending school and make arrangements to get their child registered.

School assignments for the next school year will not necessarily be based on where children are registered, school officials said.

There is a need for maximum registration at this time. Complete information regarding the number of children who will attend kindergarten in the fall will enable school officials to employ the proper number of teachers, to equip necessary classrooms and to take any additional steps needed to help children take the first step to school happily and naturally, an official school system spokesman said.

The annual Pre-School Get-Togethers at the various elementary schools have been set for the period between May 18-20.
