The Executive Committee of the Warner Farms Improvement Association, after reviewing the proposed 1959-60 Farmington City budget, disclosed there is a 25% mill assessment which is a 25% tax increase.

There are no detailed new programs outlined in the budget to support such an increase. Association officials said. The association has addressed the council requesting a resubmission on the old 10 mill rate and an explanation of all new programs.

At the same time the Council was asked to review the fact that the City Hall employees continue to increase in number and have more than doubled since 1955 in the face of a decrease in revenues associated with their functions.
