A 10-ft. tall Scout tent is set for the outdoor arena; weather permitting at 8 p.m. Saturday and 5:30 p.m. Sunday.

At 3:30 p.m. Saturday and 1:30 Sunday, Rips Collins and his bullwhip act and Elaine Kremer who rides 12 to 16 horses at a time are scheduled.

Horses, carts and a firetruck will be available for conveying visitors around the 168 acre estate.

The Scout-O-Rama is open to the public from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. Saturday and from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. Sunday. It is a day of fun, games, and exhibits, and camporee, formerly held separately.

About 50,000 tickets have been sold. Tickets at 25 cents each, are available at the Ivory estate, 2900 Cooley Lake Road, two miles west of Union Lake Village. There is parking space for about 20,000 cars.
