Area Catholic Charities Served More Than 41,000 During 1958
The 36 Catholic social agencies of the Archdiocese of Detroit last year provided service for more than 41,000 people, including 11,000 families in the counties of Oakland, Wayne, Lapeer, St. Clair, Macomb, Washtenaw, Lenawee and Monroe.
This was revealed with distribution of the 78-page illustrated 1958 Catholic Charities Annual Report to the Archdiocese. The Sisters made 5,000 visits to homes of the sick poor and 19,000 girls to free summer camps.
Support for the work of Catholic Charities is received from United Foundation and Community Chest campaigns conducted in Southeastern Michigan, the Archdiocesan Development Fund, and individual contributions.
The Catholic Charities of the Archdiocese of Detroit is a non-profit corporation organized under the laws of the State of Michigan. As the coordinating and supervisory body of charitable activities of the Archdiocese, Catholic Charities has a two-fold function. This is carried out through an administrative department and the member social welfare agencies, which are staffed by professionally trained personnel and volunteer workers. It renders service direct to the needy and it counsels and represents all charitable agencies operating throughout the Archdiocese, placing children away from their own homes in boarding homes, a school for retarded girls and providing temporary and permanent residence for small children and dependent boys and girls.
Family services include counseling on religious, marital, financial, psychological and social problems.
