A varied program of sacred music will be presented by a quartet from Toconoa Falls Bible College in the Gallean Baptist Church located at 28875 West Seven Mile Rd. on Sunday June 28 at 11:00 a.m.

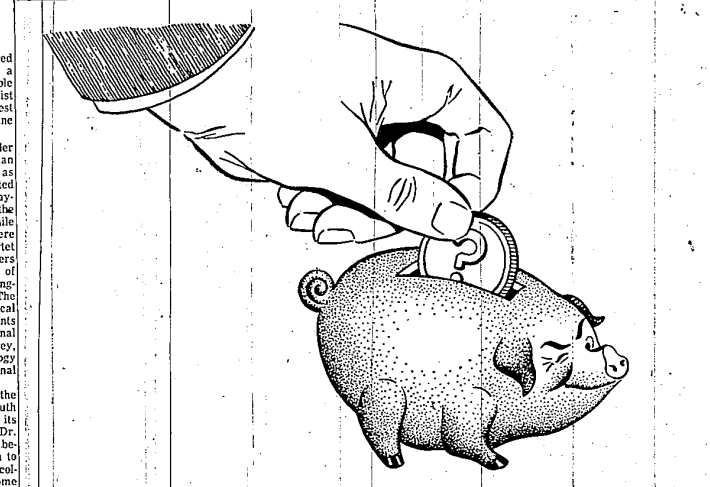
The musical group is under the direction of Professor Julian Lee Bandy. After serving as Trombonist in the United States Air Force. He played in the marching band of the University of Michigan while completing graduate study there.

Other members of the quartet include the Misses John Mayers of Reynolds, Ohio; Betty Boyer of Toledo, Ohio; and Doris Bingham of Shalersville, Ohio. The program contains unusual vocal and instrumental arrangements of contemporary and traditional sacred music. James Lindsey, professor of bible and Theology will give a short, inspirational message based on the bible.

Toconoa Falls Institute is the oldest bible college in the South having been established at its present location in 1911, by Dr. R.A. Forrest. From a small beginning the school has grown to be one of the larger bible colleges of America. Students come from Twenty-five states, three foreign countries, and the District of Columbia.

The program will attempt to make them more useful library assistants when they return to their high school classes in the fall and will try to provide them with new ideas.

They will all reside in Smith Burnham hall, just across the road from the new Dwight B. Waldo Library where the department of librarianship is housed.
