## Plan Special Polio-Fighting Drive in August

Their treasuries empty, fifty three county March of Dimes chapters will conduct an emergency appeal for funds during the month of August. Paul D. East Lansing, state chairman of the polio-fighting organization announced today.

Last year's polio epidemic in Detroit (through the number of long term patients) throughout the state requiring expensive hospitalization and therapy has made heavy chapter funds making the emergency campaign necessary.

"Every day, these chapters are going deeper into debt," on the basis of the number of patients now being cared for, it is estimated we will owe hospitals more than \$1,000,000 by the end of the year.

"If we have another epidemic the picture will of course be blacker," Bagwell said the 1959 March of Dimes held in January did not raise sufficient funds to carry chapters through the month either nationally or in Michigan.

"As a result, the National Foundation also has exhausted its polio emergency fund and no longer can send additional monies to local volunteer organizations for polio care," he explained.

While the August campaign will not be "state-wide," Bagwell said it is scattered and the appeal will assume state-wide importance. County chapters will set their own dates for campaigns in the month and retain 100 per cent of the monies raised for local use.
