## Let More Gas Permits

About 1,200  
Available Here

Heating firms in this area are now geared to install that new gas heating unit you've been waiting for or to convert your present heating unit to gas.

Approximately 6,000 space heating permits have been released for the West Wayne District of the Southeast Division of Consumers Power Co., which includes Farmington, according to James Thomas, district manager. Of this total approximately 1,200 are being made available to Farmington residents, he added.

FOR MANY it has been a long wait, Thomas indicated. Applications for which permits have now been made available date back as far as May of 1937.

Notices are now being sent out by Consumers Power to all individuals and builders who have made application for gas since this time it is necessary to install some other type of heating system and will not be interested in making use of their application now, Thomas commented.

It is quite certain that many of those who took out permits for gas heating some time ago have since found it necessary to install some other type of heating system and will not be interested in making use of their application now, Thomas commented.

INCLUDED IN the notices being mailed by Consumers are cards which those still interested are asked to fill out and return as soon as possible. It will be assumed that those not returning cards are no longer interested in having gas heating facilities, Thomas said.

Those who have been on the waiting list longest still wanting gas will receive gas space heaters which they in turn take to the heating contractor of their choice.

The contractor will be asked to indicate on the permit form
