Annual VFW Student Essay Contest Opens

The opening of its 25th annual National High School Essay Contest was announced last week by the Ladies Auxiliary to the Veterans of Foreign Wars. The topic will be "Civil Defense — An American Tradition."

Students in all public, private and parochial high schools are eligible to enter the contest. National prizes are: First, \$1,000 cash; second, \$500; third, \$250; and fourth, \$100; plus 20 cash honorable mention awards.

In addition, the federal office of Civil Aid and Defense Mobilization will award a \$100 U.S. Savings Bond to the first-place winner in each state. State and local contest winners also receive additional Auxiliary awards which vary with the community.

The essay contest was started by the V.F.W. Auxiliary in 1935 to encourage young people to think and write on patriotic subjects. During the last school year more than 35,000 students from all 50 states and the District of Columbia entered the national contest. Dr. Shane MacCarthy, director of the President's Council on Youth Fitness, was chairman of the national judges.

Further information on the 1959 contest may be obtained from local Auxiliary units, or from the Essay Department, West 84th Street, Kansas City 11, Missouri.

Auxiliary members annually give more than three million dollars, and more than six million hours, to volunteer services for hospitalized veterans and their families, community service, Americanism programs, assistance to youth groups, civil defense and industrial training veterans and their families. Members are the wives, mothers, sisters, daughters and widows of veterans who served in the U.S. armed forces, or women who have themselves had overseas service.

Special Soil Conservation Stamp Coming

The Oakland County soil conservation district is one of more than 2,800 such districts throughout the country being honored by issuance of a commemorative soil conservation stamp by the post office department, according to Robert McCrory, chairman of the soil conservation stamp promotion committee.

The stamp will be issued August 26 at Rapid City, S. D., at the annual meeting of the Conservation Society of America, and will go on sale at local post offices the following day, McCrory said. The stamp, in colors, depicts a modern conservation farm, and is of 4-cent denomination.

The Oakland County soil conservation district was organized by local farmers in 1935. The district now has 326 active co-operators, of whom 238 have basic conservation plans.

Here are some of the accomplishments in the district by its co-operators: 33 Basic Farm Plans, 842 acres Conservation Crop Rotation, 179 acres Pasture Planting, 333 acres Tree Planting, 2 miles of hedgerow planting, 4 miles of line drainage, 173 acres, and 12 farm ponds.

Report Cases Of Whooping Cough Way Up

The Michigan Department of Health urges all parents of young children to make sure that their children are protected against whooping cough as well as polio and other communicable diseases.

The department said it was issuing the plea because whooping cough cases so far this year are about double the number a year ago.

Through the first 23 weeks of 1959, the department received reports of 1,061 cases, compared with 503 cases in the same period last year.

There were three deaths from the disease through June of this year, as against two in the same period last year.

Whooping cough hits hardest in very young children, and the state health department recommends that children be protected against whooping cough as early in life as possible. Most doctors begin their four-shot immunization series when the child is three months old. The other three shots follow at one-month intervals.

A booster dose is given when the child reaches two years of age and again when he is five. Protection usually is given by administering a vaccine that protects against diphtheria and tetanus.

The state health department recently changed its immunization recommendations to include a whooping cough booster at the age of five years.

Many of the cases reported so far this year have been in five-year-old and six-year-old youngsters who have not been immunized as infants and again at two years. The department explained that their immunity apparently "wore out" and was too weak to protect without being strengthened by a booster shot.

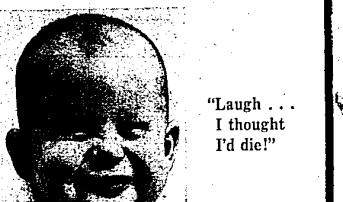
