Telephone listings of several number of telephones from 3,000 to 12,600," he said.

"Most of the sparsely settled and isolated communities of the past now are solidly filled in; some annexed adjacent land for future expansion, and many new communities have been formed. As a result, telephone exchange boundaries no longer follow political boundaries, and finding telephone numbers sometimes can be a problem."

UNDER THE plan, 29 telephone exchanges serving more than 100 communities surrounding Detroit will be split into six area Yellow Pages directories. These same 29 exchanges will be divided into three area White Pages directories.

In December, Farmington telephone users will receive their first redesigned Yellow Pages directories. In them, each heading will have complete alphabetical lists of all establishments doing business in the communities served by the Farmington, Livonia, Novi, and Plymouth exchanges.

THE NEW WHITE Pages directories will be distributed in Farmington next spring. They will consist of a single alphabetical list of all telephone users in the communities served by the following 13 exchanges: Belleville, Farmington, Flat Rock, Livonia, New Boston, Northville, Plymouth, Redford, Romulus, Trenton, Wayne, Wyandotte, and Ypsilanti.
