PROPOSITION — ROAD MILLAGE

Timely Tips on GARDENING

As cooler weather arrives annual plants flower more gaily and profusely, but mums are now the highlight of the garden scene. The charming, late-blooming perennials are mums. They are hardy and profuse. Frost that withers annuals and dims the glow of most perennials does no harm to mums. They will provide garden color and after other flowers are gone plants increase in size each year and can readily be divided to make new plants, or cuttings can easily be rooted.

Mums come in such a wide range of colors that they can be used in an infinite variety of color schemes from delicate combinations of pastel looking pinks, mauves, and creamy white to dramatic blends of glowing reds and deep purples and brilliant yellows. Gold and bronze tones combine especially well with autumn hued foliage of trees and shrubs to create a delightful late-season garden picture.

Not the least of the attributes that endure mums to gardeners is ease with which they can be transplanted. Mums have a fibrous root system that is shallow and compact. Because of this, even large plants can be moved in full bloom. A bit of extra watering for a day or two will prevent wilting and flowering will continue unabated.

A few mums set in from autumn evergreens will add a cheery note of welcome at the house entrance, or several tucked into a large tub or pot will add sparkle to the backyard terrace.

CHOOSING EVERGREENS

Evergreens have justly earned their popularity as dooryard and foundation plants. They provide a welcome note of green throughout the year and are relatively trouble free if the proper type is chosen for each particular site.

When planning evergreens the mature size of the plants should be considered, and enough space allowed between plants and between the house and the plant. Small size plants become established quickly and will grow rapidly. Regrets and trouble will result from squeezing in extra plants to give a fuller and more finished immediate effect.

As well as spacing, the ultimate size and shape of the mature plant must be considered. Yews and junipers, the two most popular evergreen species, have spreading forms, medium height and compact forms. It is foolish, and practically impossible to try to impose an unnatural shape on a plant. The quality of a mulch and judicious staking will not change an upright form to a spreader, or visa-versa.

Before selecting a plant, know what it will look like at maturity, and select plants whose mature form and size fit the space requirements of your home. Use low spreading types beneath picture windows or to surround and face-down taller specimens. Use columnar or pyramidal types as accents at doorways or house corners.
