Adult Classes At WSU, U of M Still Open

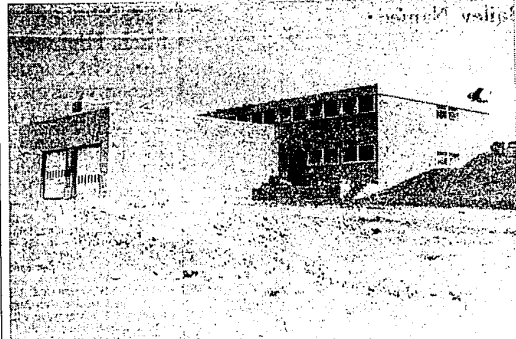
Registration for the more than 100 courses offered by the combined Division of Adult Education of Wayne State University and University of Michigan...

The registration office is located at 60 Forsworth in the Rackham Memorial and will be open daily from 8:30 a.m. to 8:30 p.m. Saturday office hours are 9 a.m. to 1:30 p.m.

No formal entrance requirements are necessary to participate in the courses offered. While the teaching staff is drawn primarily from the resident faculty of the two universities, no college credit is given. Tuition fees average \$20.00 per course.

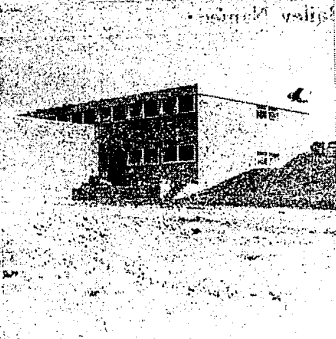
