MACP Plans Safety Drive

The Michigan Association of Chiefs of Police will undertake a special six-month program of traffic safety in an effort to persuade drivers that voluntary compliance with traffic laws is the best way to reduce Michigan's mounting traffic accidents.
The program will enlist the personal efforts of some 200 police chiefs in Michigan urban communities. The Michigan State Police will assist in rural areas.
This is the first time that the MACP has engaged in a statewide activity of this nature.
Police officials everywhere are concerned about two major problems, namely that there is a growing gap between the ratio of enforcement manpower and population plus increasing demands and responsibilities in all areas of enforcement.
