

Farmington Returns to Form, 6-0

A third-period fumble by Southfield High enabled the Farmington Falcons to resume their winning ways last Friday night.

After recovering the miscue on Southfield's 40-yard line, the Falcons drove in to score in seven plays to earn a 6-0 nod over the hosting Jays. Farmington's quarterback, Harvey Chapman, covered the last three yards in the touchdown march.

The victory brought the Falcons' 1959 record to three wins and one loss and a 1-1 card in the Inter-Lakes circuit.

Chapman's touchdown plunge was followed by an unsuccessful attempt at the extra point and that is where the scoring ended.

BOTH TEAMS were scoreless in the first half. The Falcons dominated in the second quarter when they advanced to Southfield's two. But the stubborn Jays thwarted this attempt. Halback Larry Hawkins' 11-yard punt was the biggest individual gain in that series.

The Clarenceville defensive unit held South Lyon scoreless the rest of the way. Co-captains of the Trojan JayVees are Hamlin and Bill Bradley.
