STUDIES BIG PROBLEM

BUREAU OF SOCIAL HYGIENE IS EXPLAINED.

ohn D. Rockefeller, Jr., Tells of its Origin. Work and Plans for the Investigation of Vice Conditions.

Conditions.

New York, Jan. 27.—In order that the public onlyth better understand the bureau of Social Hyghene, John D. Rockefeller, Jr., today gave out a structure, explaining the origin, work and plans of that institution. The bureau, he said, camb into existence about two y-ars ago as a result of the work of a special grand jury appointed to investigate the white slave traffic in New York city. This jury recommended that a public commission he appointed to study the social evil.

Mr. Rockefeller was foreman of that grand jury and he thereafter gave the subject deep thought and conferred with a large number of leading men and, women. These conferences, says Mr. Rockefeller, "developed the feeling that a public commission would labor-under a number of disadvantage, such as the fact, that it would be short threat it work would be done; publicly; that at best it could hardly do more than present recommendations. So the conviction jerew that in order to make a real and lasting improvement in conditions, a permanent organization should be created, the continuation of which would not be dependent upon a temporary wave of reform, nor upon; the life of any man or group of men, but which would go no generation after generation, continuously making warfare against the forces of well.
