Clareville's board of education is having difficulty coming up with a mutually agreeable name for its district's new elementary school, now being built at Louise street between Seven and Eight Mile roads in Livonia.

Some time ago they considered naming it after Louis E. Schmidt, Superintendent of the Clareville school system. However, Schmidt requested that it not be named after him. Since that time, a suitable name has not been found by board members.

At the last regular board of education meeting, members considered naming it: New Central; Grove school, and Beechwood. In all three cases, a move to decide it one way or the other was made, but the names if used for lack of support by a few members.

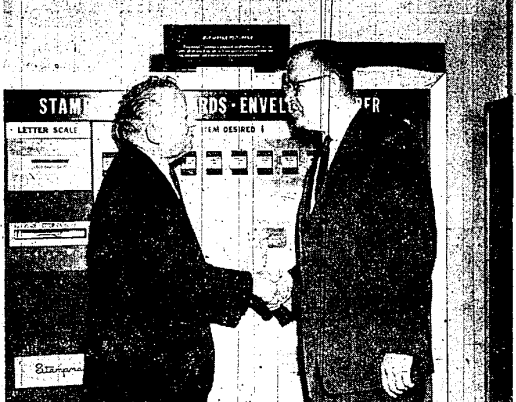
He served aboard the destroyer USS Vogelgesang and held the rating of SEP 3/c.

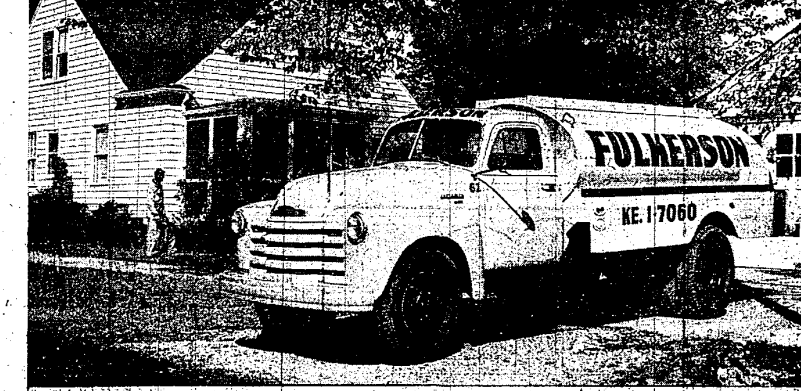
