# Will Quit-Claim 15' Greenbelt

Joseph Kaufman, partial owner of the land on which Bel-Aire Shopping Center is situated, has indicated his willingness to concede any ownership of a 15-foot wide greenbelt behind the shopping area.

City Manager Earl Scherffius related this turn of events to the city council at its last regular meeting last week.

EARLIER, Scherffius had told Kaufman that the city was considering vacating the greenbelt, with half of it reverting to the shopping center and the remaining half going to property owners on the Folkstone street. Then Kaufman offered to quit-claim his share.

Scherffius asked Kaufman if he would move his stockade fence from the western edge of the greenbelt to the eastern edge. On this request, Kaufman is conferring with business associates.

Kaufman's quit-claim of the greenbelt would give all of the width of it to the Folkstone street property owners. However, an easement down the center of the belt would be retained for utilities.

Emory Jacques, attorney for Mr. and Mrs. Buck and Vidan, who is also an attorney, argued their cases before councilmen Monday night.

The arguments of the two lawyers will be submitted to City Attorney Robert Kelly, who will make a recommendation at the next meeting of the council.
