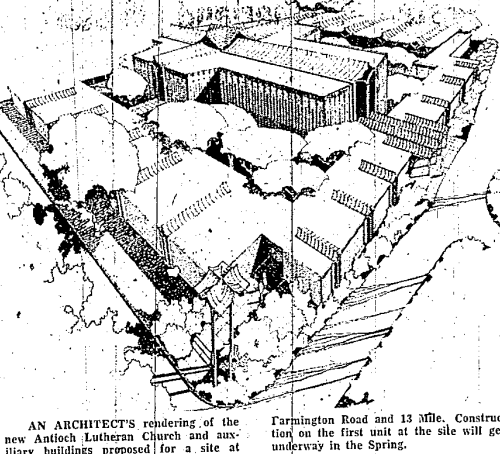

Troop S-14 To Get Flag

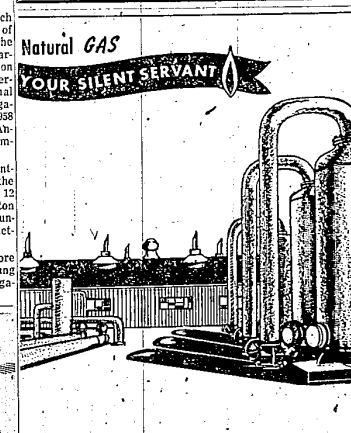
Boy Scout Troop S-14 sponsored by the North Congregational Church, Southfield, will receive a new 50 star American flag tonight, Thursday, November 19.

"Packing Houses" Aid Natural Gas Service

Natural gas is carefully "packed" as it travels along the 2,000 mile trip from the southwestern gas fields to Michigan customers. Taking care of the "packing" operation are gas compressor stations that every hundred miles along the pipeline route.
