

JCs to Circulate Petitions For Constitutional Amendment

The Michigan Junior Chamber of Commerce at their fall board of directors meeting adopted the first phase of their action program Operation Constitutional Survey.

Fred Warner, president of the Michigan Jaycees, said, "After extensive study and review of Michigan's problems as they relate to our present day Constitution, the operation of the Michigan Jaycees, headed by Robert Dwyer of Plymouth and Jack Rasky of Garden City, presented their recommendation to the state Jaycee Board of Directors."

The recommendation as approved by the board calls for the circulation of petitions to acquire a sufficient number of signatures to place a constitutional amendment on the November 1959 ballot.

Warner continued by stating that, "This amendment will change part of article 17, Section 4 of the State Constitution in four ways:

1. It will provide for again placing, in the spring of 1961, the question of calling for a Constitutional Convention;
2. It will change the requirement for passage of the convention call from a majority of those voting in the election to a majority of those voting on the question;
3. It will expedite the selection of the delegates;
4. It will change the basis of selecting the delegates.

Warner concluded, "Petitions will be circulated by over 5,000 Michigan Jaycees to acquire the necessary number of signatures for the placing of the amendment on the November 1959 ballot."
