Muscular Dystrophy Drive On

A drive to raise funds for the Muscular Dystrophy Association of America is now underway throughout the nation. It will last until Dec. 31.

The local Oakland County campaign chairman is Helen Martin, who may be contacted for further information at TR 9-0723.

Muscular dystrophy, a mysterious disease, attacks the muscles, thereby weakening and disabling the victim to the point where a minor ailment may be fatal. The most significant part of the Muscular Dystrophy Association's program is its research objective to discover the cause, cure and treatment of the disease.

A separate campaign is conducted annually to insure that the battle against the disease is properly financed. Chapter members do more than simply make collections. They also make known the facts surrounding the disease.

Three of the victims were women who succumbed while attending a religious camp in September. Five hunters, all died following the opening of the deer season.

In addition, two couples camped in a trailer in a deer area were overcome but recovered.

Says Has Way To Combat Water Rust

A Michigan State University professor says he's found a way cities can coat their water pipes to eliminate rusty water.

Dr. Robert F. McCauley, a civil engineering professor, is the head of a laboratory working on the problem and has applied his findings to an M.S.U. greenhouse system.

The treated water is run through the pipes in about two hours coats them with a thin layer of limestone.

According to Dr. McCauley, the treated water is harmless; M.S.U. researchers have drunk it themselves. However, it is not yet ready to taste a bit unpleasant.
