Apply Early for Your SS Benefits, Plea

Advanced filing of claims for social security benefits is now being encouraged, according to an announcement today by William E. LaRock, manager of the Pontiac social security district office. He explained that early filing of applications for retirement benefits will result in prompt receipt of the first check.

"Inquire before you retire is a theme we've been emphasizing for several months now, in an effort to ensure speedy delivery of the first benefit check," LaRock pointed out. He went on to emphasize that retiring workers would do well to call at the Pontiac office two to three months ahead of their retirement date and get their applications in early.

Benefit claims require some handling in the Pontiac office before they are certified to the Treasury Department of payment. The worker's earnings record and evidence of his age must be obtained. "Getting your claim filed ahead of your retirement will allow for completion of these necessary details," LaRock continued, "so that when you have stopped work, your first social security check will arrive when you need it most."

He also commented upon two questions which he says are commonly asked about filing for social security. What should a claimant bring with him? — 2. Is an appointment necessary?

"Generally speaking," some proof of age and earnings statement (Form W-2) or copy of last year's Federal income tax return should be brought when you come to apply for your social security," LaRock stated. Other documents may be necessary in some cases. He emphasized in closing that no appointment is necessary. The Pontiac office, located at 18 S. Perry St. is open Monday through Friday from 8:45 to 4:45 p.m.

Notify VA of New Address

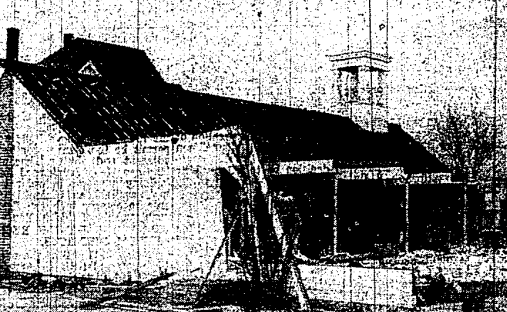
Veterans who move and fail to notify the Veterans Administration are almost certain to get into have check troubles. It's all the result of new regulations explained Lloyd H. Jameson, Manager of VA's Regional Office in Detroit.

Effective November 20, the VA must terminate payments to any veteran once the Treasury gets back two undeliverable checks.

Mr. Jameson advised veterans who move to do two things: Notify the post office so that checks can be forwarded, and let the VA in on the change at once.

Changes of address must be signed by the veteran and sent to the VA Regional Office in Detroit. Do not send them to the Treasury Department, Mr. Jameson warned. That starts additional problems.
