### X-ray Crash Claims One

A Madison Heights motorist died Monday evening in an expressway crash near Novi when his brand new car careened into a bridge abutment and was demolished.

Novi police chief Lee Begole theorized that Bernard J. Tyler, 43, either fell asleep at the wheel or suffered a fatal heart attack. Tyler's auto was traveling in the west-bound lane at 610 p.m. when it suddenly veered off the highway and hit an abutment supporting the Novi road bridge.

Tyler, who lived at 676 West Kalana in Madison Heights, was dead when Novi police reached the scene. The speedometer on Tyler's new car was jammed at 65 miles per hour. The car still had the purchase delivery ticket pasted to a rear window and had been driven only 128 miles.

Michigan State police were called in to extract the body from the totally-demolished auto. Novi police assisted.

### Nathan Lurie, Here as Youth, Dies Sunday

Nathan W. Lurie, head of the Wigley stores who died Sunday, was a resident of Farmington in his early youth, as was, of course, the other brother Jack who was his partner in the supermarket chain.

E. Roy Hattion of Farmington, who was born here and is the longtime circulation manager of Detroit Free Press, remembers that when he was a youngster something between 1900 and 1905 the family came to Farmington from Detroit. He thinks Nate was five or six years old at that time.

The Lurie family had a small store on the south side of Grand River, about where Harris Homestead House now stands. They operated the store a couple of years, then moved back to Detroit. Nate helped Roy Hattion deliver The Free Press.

When Nate became a young man he and his brother borrowed \$200 and opened a small store at Grand River and Quincy. This grew into several stores, then a chain of 115 stores in many states.
