Hare in Race for Governor In 1960 Strongly Indicated

ONE JUMPED IN - another jumped out.
Secretary of State James M. Hare, although he has reported that he is off and running for the Democratic nomination for governor in 1960, has left little doubt he is considering himself in the race.
State Treasurer Sanford has just about counted himself out. Brown, like Hare, is a state winner on Gov. G. Mennen Williams' team.

A year ago, Brown was among those mentioned as possible contenders for Williams' job when the Governor steps down. He ran strong in the 1958 election, displayed an earthy touch, and cultivated backing in rural areas, where he was known as "Farmer Brown."
But Brown indicated he has no interest in a primary struggle.

There are those in party leadership who say it would be just as well if Brown did not run. They say it would be easy for opponents to pick on the man who holds the state's purse strings during the period of fiscal crisis, however removed he may be from the cause of the crisis.
A primary race is expected among Democrats when Williams calls it quits.

Township Board Proceedings

A Regular Meeting of the Farmington Township Board was called for Nov. 24th, A.D. 1959 at 8:00 P.M. by Mr. Curt Hall, Chairman.

Members present were: Mr. Hall, Chairman; Mr. Wilcox, Vice-Chairman; Mr. Joseph Brennan, Township Attorney; Mr. Wilcox, Township Clerk; Mr. Hall, Treasurer; Mr. Wilcox, Assessor; Mr. Hall, Engineer.

MOTION by Wilcox, supported by Cairns, that we support the recommendation of the Planning Board and deny the request for rezoning of five lots at NW corner of 11 Mile and Middlefield, Farmington, Mich. Roll Call Vote: 7 Yeas, 1 Nay, Brown, Carried.

MOTION by Cairns, supported by Avery, that we accept the Planning Board's recommendation and deny the request of Mr. Diehl for rezoning of lot size on 58 acres on 14 Mile in Section 3. Roll Call Vote: 7 Yeas, 0 Nays.

MOTION by Bassette, supported by Hug, that we rezoned 25 acres of Farmington, Mich. Sec. 23, from Residential to B-1 Commercial, as requested, and that the Map show this change. Roll Call Vote: 7 Yeas, Carried, unanimous.

MOTION by Wilcox, supported by Cairns, that we offer \$3500 for the purchase of property adjacent to Wheeler Street Stationing Board and deny the request to be used as parking lot.

Mr. Brown thinks we should have a legal opinion on Township buying property without vote of people - should be checked.

MOTION by Avery, supported by Brown, that Resolution requiring registration of businesses be adopted and sent to Michigan Township Association asking their support and assistance to present to the legislators in the coming session.

MOTION by Brown, supported by Bassette, that request by Bassette, that request by Paul P. and Victoria Gogates for transfer own-

phed by Hare, a leader in the fight for the public's right to know who is fast becoming the best known Michigan Democrat officeholder outside of the office of the Governor.

The 1960 legislature can expect to hear from Jim Hare on his proposal to create a Michigan consumer protection office.

How do we know? From one of the almost daily press releases mimeographed by Hare.

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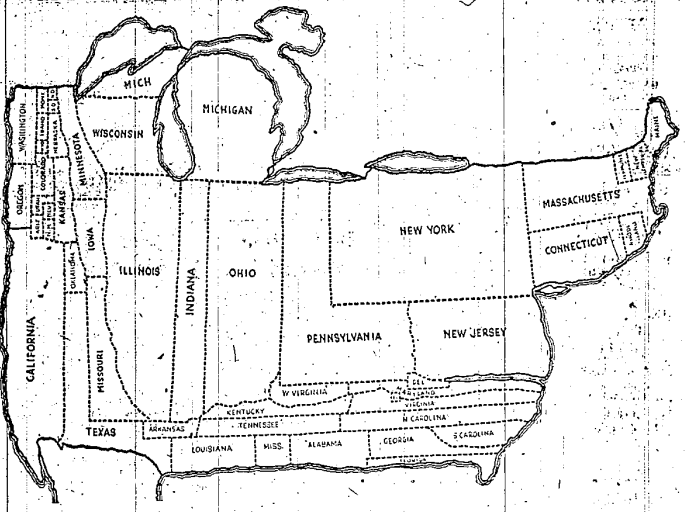
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OUR TOWN STANDS TALL ON THE MAP
