## Orchard Methodist Lays Cornerstone

A dream of ten years began taking actual form this week after the cornerstone laying of the Orchard Methodist Church on Sunday, November 29. The church was formed in 1949 and began Sunday meetings in the Albert M. Brennan's recreation room at 28552 Orchard Lake Road. The congregation soon outgrew the recreation room and bought an 18,000 sq. ft. factory building on 13 Mile Road, just east of Orchard Lake Road. Being located close to the Kendallwood, Briar Hill and Westbrook developments in the township, the congregation outgrew the factory building in 1958 and began holding services in Kenbrook School in January, 1959. Money to begin the new church building was raised in a special drive in April of this year, aided by the Methodist Union and Christ Methodist Church, Detroit. After the cornerstone laying ceremonies, Rev. Frank Cozadd, 28553 Quail Hollow Drive, minister of the church said: "This is another step forward in meeting the need for spiritual growth of the many new families moving into the area north of Farmington. We hope to expand the church to meet the ever increasing need, as the community continues to grow."

## Recollection Day Saturday

Saturday, December 12, 1959, Rev. Father Mel Brady, O.F.M., will conduct a Day of Recollection for members of the St. Elizabeth Chapter of the Third Order of St. Francis, at Duns Scotus College, W. Nine Mile and Evergreen. Starting at 2:30 p.m., this one day retreat consists of spiritual talks, meditation, and supper, followed by an open forum and a Holy Hour. Activities are concluded at 8:30 p.m. The season's eight sessions are dedicated to the theme: "The Importance of Your Faith in Your Life." They are held on the Saturday before the second Sunday of each month from October to April. There is not fee. Men of all denominations are invited. The purpose of Days of Recollection, as outlined by the Pope Pius XI, is "to bring peace to men and carry them upwards to holiness of life."

## Temperance Head Speaker

Robert Hammond, who was recently elected Executive Director of the Michigan Temperance Foundation, will speak at the First Methodist Church of Farmington on Sunday, December 13, at 9:15 and 10:40 a.m. Since 1957, Hammond has served as the Foundation's Educational Director. His background is in both teaching and public speaking. He holds a degree in teaching service and an M. A. Degree in Speech from Michigan State University. In addition to the school programs, he also speaks in churches, to service clubs, summer youth camps, and to other interested groups. Through its program of alcohol education, the Michigan Temperance Foundation seeks to give today's young people an opportunity to see the benefits of total abstinence from alcoholic drinks. According to Hammond, such educational programs as this have been instrumental in reducing the drinking rate among American adults by 12 per cent in the past 13 years. A recent Gallup Poll showed that in 1958 only 53 per cent of the nation's adults considered themselves as drinkers. A similar poll taken in 1945 showed 67 per cent of the adult population used beverage alcohol products. "Anything that interferes with individual progress ultimately will retard group progress," George H. Houston.
