MRS. TOWNS SISTER and husband from Florida were on hand to share some of the holiday festivities with them.

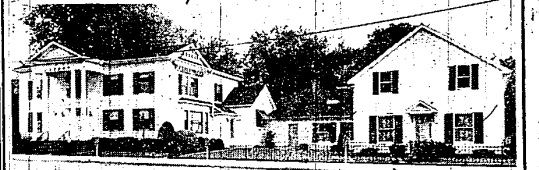

Direct from the music capital of Vienna, come 22 boys ranging in age from 8 to 14 years old to sing at Mercy College as the fourth offering in the Mercy College Artists Series.  
Their concert of sacred songs of the 16th and 17th century, Viennese waltzes, folk songs and selections from familiar operas will be heard on Sunday, January 17 at 6:30 p.m. in Meakley Auditorium on campus, 800 W. Outer Drive.  
The choir, now in its 16th tour of the United States, was founded in 1498 by Imperial decree of the Holy Roman Emperor, Maximilian I, and was exclusively controlled until 1918 by the Hapsburg Court.  
Such great talents as Franz Schubert and Josef Haydn sang with the group before their voices changed, and they became giants in the music world. To become a member of the world famous Choir, the prospect must pass rigid examinations of their scholastic ability as well as their musical talent for the organization functions as a school as well as Choir. Only about one in ten usually can qualify. On their travels they try to see all the favorite sights of the typical tourist, the Grand Canyon, Niagara Falls, and of course, sea-bathing since this is non-existent in Austria.  
Typical of the comments on their lovely voices is the one made by Louis Biancolli, critic for the New York World-Journal. "They sing with a purity and clarity that makes for a degree of perfection unapproached by their elders."
