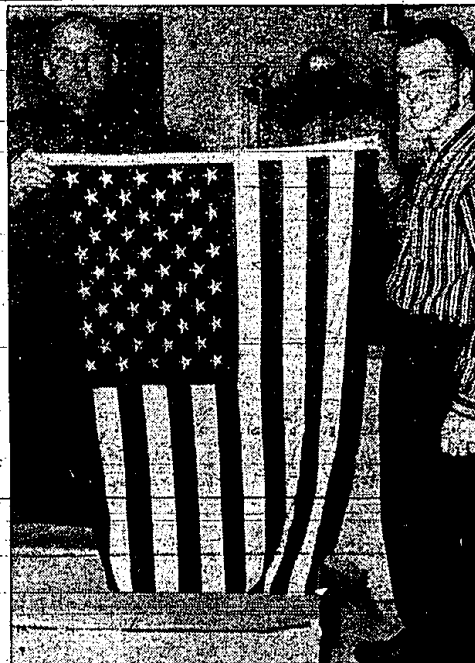

Families with children under 14, or persons 65, or older, should make special plans to evacuate these members in case of a home fire. Nearly sixty-five per cent of persons killed in homes fires each year fall in the above age groups.

The Farmington City and Township Library is located at 23333 Farmington Road.

This site and building were chosen for purchase because of the proximity to the post office, utilities, the bank, and shopping center. Under the terms of the Clinton W. Wilber will, whose bequests made the purchase possible, the library had to be located within the City of Farmington.

Considerable thought was given to the site and building before it was purchased for the present library.

The building has 3,800 square feet of space, and ample parking space at the rear of the building. Patrons are requested to park their cars in the parking lot and not in the driveway.

THE LIBRARY is administered by a four man Board of Trustees, who are appointed by the two governing units. Each unit appoints two trustees. The present Board consists of: C. Goddard Smith, President, (City); Russell Ellis, Vice President, (Township); Howard Thayer, Treasurer, (City); and Mary F. Allison, Secretary, (Township).

The library income is derived from taxes from the community served (a 3 mill levy on equalized valuation of all property) plus individual gifts.

YOUR LIBRARY is open 5 days a week. Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday from 9:00 a.m.-9:00 p.m. and Saturday from 9:00 a.m.-5:00 p.m. It has a shelf capacity for double the number of books now available. The personnel consists of 4 1/2 staff members, and a custodian. Its resources are available, free of charge to any resident, taxpayer, or person employed in Farmington City and Township, plus any student attending Farmington Schools.

The major part of the book collection circulates for two weeks. New titles, seasonal books, and those books in heavy demand for school assignments are circulated for one week. Overdue charges are 2c per day on two week material and 5c per day on 1 week materials.

AS OF FEBRUARY 1st, 1960 there were 8,429 registered borrowers. In the past 11 months these patrons have borrowed 99,575 books and asked 3,018 reference questions. The increased
