**LEGAL NOTICE**

**VILLAGE OF QUAKERTOWN ORDINANCE** TO REQUIRE THE LAYING OF CURBS IN ROAD-SIDE DITCHES TO PROMOTE THE DEPOSITING OF ANY MATERIALS IN ROAD-SIDE DITCHES AND TO PROVIDE PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS OF THE PROVISIONS THEREOF.

1. Before beginning any construction work of any kind on any property which adjoins a public road the building contractor or other person responsible for the construction shall provide and install in the road-side drainage ditch between said road and said property a ditch culvert of corrugated iron, not less than 18 feet in length and of a diameter to be approved by the Quakertown Village Road Commissioner, and shall cover the same across said roadside drainage ditch with sufficient gravel to prevent damage to the said culvert from culvert by vehicular traffic passing over said culvert.

2. No builders' materials of any sort or nature or debris from any building operation shall be moved into or deposited in any road-side ditch in the Village of Quakertown and upon discovery of the existence of any said prohibited materials the Quakertown Village Road Commissioner shall prohibit further operations in connection with the construction being carried on by any person or persons responsible for the depositing of said road-side drainage ditch so as to be in violation of this condition is corrected.

3. No person shall at any time deposit any materials of any kind including dirt, sand, gravel, clay or other type of soil in any road-side drainage ditch so as to be in violation of this condition or impede the flow of water there-through, nor shall any person change in any way the contours of any such drainage ditch without the express written approval of the Quakertown Village Road Commissioner.

4. A violation of this ordinance shall be a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punishable by a fine of not to exceed \$100.00 or by imprisonment in the Oakland County Jail for not to exceed 90 days or by both such fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the court.

5. This ordinance shall become effective upon first publication in the Farmington Enterprise, Farmington, Michigan, a newspaper circulated in said Village of Quakertown.

**Qualify Okay For Law Office**

A proposal before the Farmington Township Zoning Board of Appeals was presented to the planning board for its opinion at the last regular meeting of the board.

The question was whether a 30 foot set-back instead of a 40 foot, as required, should be allowed to permit the erection of a law office at Gill Road and Grand River next to the dental clinic presently located here. The request to the appeal board for this exception has been made by Earl Lathrup.

He proposes a 40 ft. x 40 ft. building on a 70 foot lot. The planning board, which the request was reasonable but felt that approval should be conditioned. Agreement by the board to provide parking at the rear of the building and to erect a four foot fence or screening on the side next to residential lots in the rear should be required, the Planning Board felt.

**'Stick-Out' Sign Request Tabled**

Owners of the Bel-Aire Lanes bowling establishment appealed to the Farmington City Council Monday night for a sign permit to allow the erection of a 'stick out' sign on their building on Orchard Lake Road.

Under terms of a sign ordinance passed by the city in January of 1959 such 'stick-out' signs have been prohibited. Ordinances have been issued that all such signs existing out over easements more than 15 inches must be taken down by June of this year.

Considerable opposition to this ordinance has been voiced in recent weeks by owners of business establishments throughout the city.

A lighted sign advertising the Grosse Pointe, a restaurant, occupying a portion of the Bel-Aire Lanes building, is proposed by the owners of the bowling establishment.

In presenting their case to the Council, the owners brought out the fact that a 'stick-out' sign at the front of the building would be much better than one on the side. A building top sign would not only be unsatisfactory to nearby homeowners, it was emphasized.

The owners did not feel that a sign flag against the building would be of much value. It would not be visible to passing motorists they contended.

The matter was tabled pending a review of the general feeling among businessmen regarding enforcement of the ordinance at this time.
