Russell Waack, manager of the National Food Store located at Orchard Lake Road and 10 Mile Road, is a real veteran in the food merchandising business.

Russ started his career 21 years ago with the C.F.S. chain. After a short period of training, he was made manager of a store. Russ is quick to point out that the stores in those days were very small and that it was not uncommon for a new employee to achieve a managerial position after a short tenure with the company.

When the Smith chain was bought out by the National organization, Russ stayed on and has been manager of several of the company's stores.
