Corporation Tax to Be \$4,969,141. Corporation Tax to Be \$4,59,141. The state tax commission finished, its work on the assessed valuation of the corporations in Michigai assessed by them, which inclutes raifroads, sleeping car companies, express com-panies, car-basing companies and tele-phone and telegraph companies. The corporation values are fixed at \$235, 867,252 and on a \$2039 per \$1,000 dat seesed valuation they will pay taxes to the state ascretating \$4,960,141.08, as compared to an assessed valuation last year of \$237,186,100, when at a \$20,70 tax rate this paid taxes amount-ing to \$4,012,866,52.
