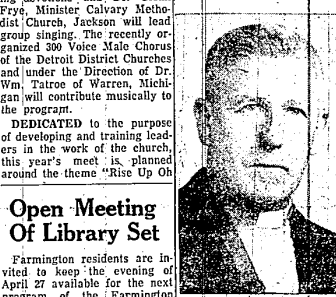

## MSUO Plans New Departure

Michigan State University Oakland today finished preliminary planning for a new departure in college programs.  
With the help of six foreign studies experts here for a three day conference, tentative outlines were laid for a year's sequence of courses in Asiatic and Russian studies to be required of all students. These, along with study of the Chinese language, may begin next September. Over one-third of MSUO's students already are studying the Russian language. MSUO personnel also will offer their services to nearby high schools to help them get started teaching the Chinese language there.  
The studies of Asiatic and Russian cultures are to be followed as soon as possible by African, Islamic and Latin-American studies.  
This program, the experts said, will be unique. While several other universities have various kinds of foreign studies, none of them require all students to take a year's sequence in the study of non-Western civilizations.
