Timely Tips on GARDENING

LAWNS
As winter snows receded attention was focused once again on the lawn. A good lawn care program for lawn care includes seeding, mowing, raking, watering, feeding, weeding, and pest control. Building new lawns also involves careful grading and soil conditioning.

Tremendous improvements have been made in lawn care techniques in recent years. More has been learned in the past decade than in all the past history of turf making.

LAWN SEED
In this area most lawns are of Kentucky blue-grass. This type of seed, which incidentally is not developed in Kentucky but in England, grows best in cool weather. During the heat of mid-summer it tends to become diseased and dormant, and therefore turns brown. The Merion variety of blue-grass is a hot weather type that remains green and thrives in hot weather. It is much superior to common Kentucky blue-grass, but needs huge amounts of nitrogen.

Another new development is Delta blue-grass. This type, which originated in Canada, is very similar in appearance and performance to Kentucky blue-grass, but has the advantage of germinating quickly and producing a thick turf in a short time.

COMBINATION of Delta and Merion blue-grass is ideal for starting a new lawn. The Delta gets the lawn off to a rapid and good start, but allows the Merion to take over as it grows and strengthens.

It is recommended that mixtures for this locality also include pennsylvania fescue. This recently developed fescue blends well with the blue-grass, and will succeed in dry, shady, or acidic spots that will not support a good crop of blue-grass. In other areas where blue-grass thrives the fescue will eventually disappear.

LAWN FERTILIZER
Turf experts agree that old-time lawn fertilizers, based on organic fertilizer formulas, over-fertilized grass with nitrogen and phosphorus and do not provide enough nitrogen. Several new nitrogen mixtures are available, which are better, with fewer applications during the growing season.

An even greater improvement is the long lasting urea-formaldehyde fertilizers that slowly release small amounts of nitrogen continuously over an extended period of time. One application early in Spring will last all season. Grass will not be stimulated to over-rapid growth followed by a period of starvation. Less mowing will be required and a stronger, healthier, more resistant lawn will be produced. The urea-formaldehyde fertilizers are economical in the long run.
