### Falcon Baseball Team Makes Strong Finish

The combined batting efforts of Walled Lake, Clarencville, and Berkley totaled only six runs as the Falcons battered their end season opponents with a barrage of 18 runs to snap a three-game losing streak and finish the year with a 6-6 record.

Walled Lake sent over another ship, May 23, only to have it sunk by a Falcon seven-run blast. The Vikings were torpedoes five times in the inning. They sank before they were able to score against the bird submariners.

Farmington scored twice in the second inning on two hits and two walks. The fifth inning rally completed the Falcon scoring as they shutout Walled Lake in the 7-0 meeting. Pitcher Darryl Allen gave up only two hits and struckout nine Viking batsmen.

The Falcon five hit five walk total allowed Farmington to score the seven runs. The only two Walled Lake hits were collected in the fourth and fifth innings. John Dempsey collected a pair of hits for Farmington.

Meeting Clarencville here last Thursday, May 26, the Falcons were the winners of a non-league contest, 7-4. The visiting team had a total of four runs on seven hits with 10 errors.

The Birds finished with totals reading 7-4 and 3.

Farmington flew off to an early lead over Clarencville as they scored twice in the opening inning. In the fifth inning the Birds swooped down on the visitors to tally five runs. In the five-run fourth rally Nathan doubled to lead off, Errair singled, Allen walked, Thomas singled, Tuttle had a base hit, and Hanson made the walk to first. Errair and Thomas each picked up a pair of hits for the Birds. Allen was credited with the Farmington win.

In their last game of the season the Falcons won Inter-Lakes number four with a well-played four run attack which defeated the Berkley opposition. The Bears lost to the Birds for the second time this season in the 4-2 game.

Catcher Dempsey was injured early in the contest in a collision with Allen. He was replaced by the team's junior catcher Phil Parsons. Newburg was the winning Falcon pitcher. In the previous Farmington-Berkley game the Falcons beat the Bears in their own backyard 5-4.

Finishing the season with a triple win burst, the Birds has an Inter-Lakes record of 4-6. When the final league standings are released they will be published.

**Falcons Watch National Shot Put Mark Fall**

Although the Falcon throwers captured only 13 points in comparison to 56 points made by Pontiac Central in a duel meet at Pontiac last Thursday, some of the Falcons turned in good performances and a new shot put record was set by Pontiac.

For the Falcons, Bob Rumford took first in the quarter mile to account for five of Farmington's points. Falcon half-milers, Don Heinonen, Fred McHugh, and John Fulton, finished second, third, and fourth in their event. Bob Drummond came in third in the low hurdles and Dave Holmer captured second in the mile to make up the remaining points.

The new shot put record was set by Central's Pritchard. He broke Dallas Long's National record of 61' 5" for juniors, by achieving a throw of 61' 8".

On June 4 the Falcons will participate in the Oakland County Meet at Southfield. Schools of all classes will be present.

#### Records Fall In Final Meet

Four new school records highlighted the final track meet of the season as the Clarencville Trojans finished third behind Pontiac Northern and Bloomfield Hills at Bloomfield last Thursday afternoon.

Merton Roberts led the Trojan record breakers as he set new marks in both the low hurdles and the 220-yard dash. Merton ran the hurdles in 20.8 seconds to top the former mark of 21.3; his 220 effort was 22.1 seconds compared to the former record of 22.7.

Piet Van Summerick, Clarencville's "flying Dutchman" Netherlands, set a new American sport's career by setting a new record in the 100-yard dash. His 10.4 clocking shaved a tenth of a second off the old CHS record of 10.5.

The school pole vault records were the fourth to fall, last Thursday. Bob Martin raised the record he last year set at 10' 10" to 10' 7".

In all, seven school records were set during the season just completed. Previously, Roberts high jumped 5' 7" for a new record, and both relay teams had established new marks 2-2 in the medley and 1:55.9 in the 800-yard relay.

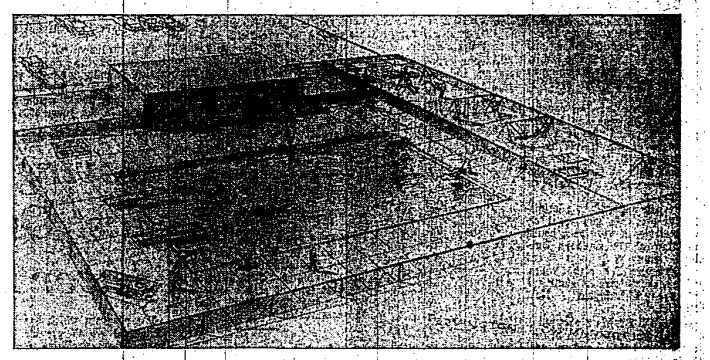
