St. John's To Install Rev. Charles Fox This Sunday
The Rev. Charles Fox will be installed as pastor of St. John's Lutheran Church, 811 Grand, Farmington, on Sunday, June 19, at 10:30 a.m. The Rev. Norman A. Meier, D.D., president of the Michigan District of the American Lutheran Church, will officiate at the installation.
Pastor Fox comes to Farmington from Ida, Michigan, where he has been serving as pastor of St. Mark's Lutheran Church, born and raised at Toledo, Ohio. He graduated from Macomber Vocational High School where he studied tool and die making. After attending night school at Toledo University for a time, he enrolled in Capital University in Columbus, Ohio, from which he graduated with a Bachelor of Arts degree in 1954, majoring in English. In 1958 he was graduated from the Evangelical Lutheran Theological Seminary in Columbus, Ohio, receiving a Bachelor of Divinity degree with honors.
Pastor Fox is married to the former Barbara Ann McLean of Toledo, who is also a graduate of Capital University in education. They have two children, Brenda Sue, 2 1/2, and Mark Charles, one year old.
St. John's Lutheran Church was started in Farmington by the Michigan District of the American Lutheran Church on November 17, 1957. For a period of one year the young congregation, officially organized on April 27, 1958 with the Rev. Donald Good as pastor, worshipped in the auditorium of the Farmington Junior High School.
Upon the completion of its first unit structure, the congregation moved into its present facilities on Gill Road, directly opposite the Alma Loma subdivision. Worship services are held regularly at 10:30 a.m. each Sunday, with church school classes for children and adults at 9:00 a.m.
From September, 1959, until the present, St. John's has been served by Pastor L. H. Pertner, who is the pastor emeritus of Zion Lutheran Church of Ferndale. In gratitude for his friendly and enthusiastic help during the past eight months, the congregation held a "thank you" party for Pastor and Mrs. Pertner on Friday, June 10, and presented them with a cash gift.

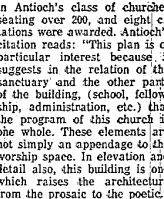

AT THE HISTORIC STRAITS OF MACKINAC

Building Plan Gets Citation
Recently the architects of the new United Lutheran Church being constructed on the corner of Twicken and Farmington Rds., entered their drawings for Antioch Evangelical Lutheran Church in a competition sponsored by the "Church Architect's Guild of America."
There were over 100 entries in Antioch's class of churches seating over 200, and eight citations were awarded. Antioch's citation reads: "This plan is of particular interest because it suggests in the relation of the sanctuary and the other parts of the building, (school, fellowship, administration, etc.) that the program of this church is one whole. These elements are not simply an appendage to the worship space. In elevation and detail also, this building is one which raises the architecture from the prosaic to the poetic."
DRAWINGS for Antioch Evangelical Lutheran Church are now among those of 65 churches being displayed on a nationwide tour by the Church Architect's Guild of America.
Construction on the first unit of this building is now progressing rapidly and is expected to be complete by Christmas.
