The rate would have been only a little over \$1,500,000 low. **BUT THIS YEAR** the state board called for increases in valuations on property in all counties throughout the state. In Oakland County the increase ran approximately six percent. The state equalized valuation for the Farmington School District was thus hiked to \$84,490,011—over \$84 million higher than the estimated valuation when the budget was prepared.

Included in the state equalized valuations is the highest equalization factor for the communities in the school district. "Proportionately," there were, although the school tax rate will be lower than planned earlier, it will be applied to a higher equalized valuation on your property.

TO FIGURE what your school tax bill will be for this year, you must first determine what the state equalized valuation on your property is. This is done by multiplying the assessed valuation on your property times the factor for the community in which the property is located. Farmington Township's factor this year is 2.03859. The City of Farmington has a factor of 1.131506.

After the state equalized valuation of your property has been established, you multiply this times the school tax rate. A home in Farmington Township having an assessed valuation of \$5,000 would have a state equalized value of \$10,295. This multiplied times the school tax rate of 2.111111 determines the total school tax which would be \$229.66.

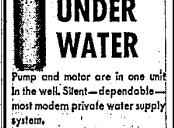
The reduction in the school tax rate will come close, although not quite offsetting, the increase in the equalization factors, as close as we can determine.

Move Ahead on Community College Plans

Recent legislative enactment of Public Law 135 has provided the means by which several public school districts maintaining grades 9 through 12 may collaborate for the purpose of forming a community college district and establishing a community college.

Over the past several years officials of the Clarencville school district, along with representatives from Garden City, Livonia, Plymouth, Redford Union and the South Bedford school districts, as a committee, have been exploring the possibilities of establishing such a college.

The northwest Wayne County area of approximately 100 square miles and containing about 250,000 residents with an assessed valuation of over \$500,000,000, is now planning to take steps through the committee in the organization of a Northwest Wayne County Community College.

THE FIRST step will be to conduct a comprehensive survey of the various pertinent factors and then the subsequent submission of an application to the Michigan Superintendent of Public Instruction for his approval.

Among other things, the survey will include a careful study of enrollment projections, the financial basis of the total area, the selection of educational needs of local area business and industry, community interest and willingness and a follow-up study of former high school graduates of the several high schools and curriculum planning for the proposed new institution.

The committee has engaged the University of Michigan Bureau of School Services to provide consultation and general direction of necessary action to consummate the establishment of the proposed community college.

DR. RAYMOND J. Young, associate professor of higher education at the University of Michigan will assume the chief responsibility. Dr. Albert M. Amerman of Henry Ford School, which is recognized as one of the finest community colleges in the country.

Although the actual establishment of the proposed college is probably several years away, the committee plans to move ahead as rapidly as possible.
