John Schmalz is manager and Clark Brands is the assistant manager of the Westbrook Nellie Davis store that takes pride in its fine reputation for handling prescriptions.

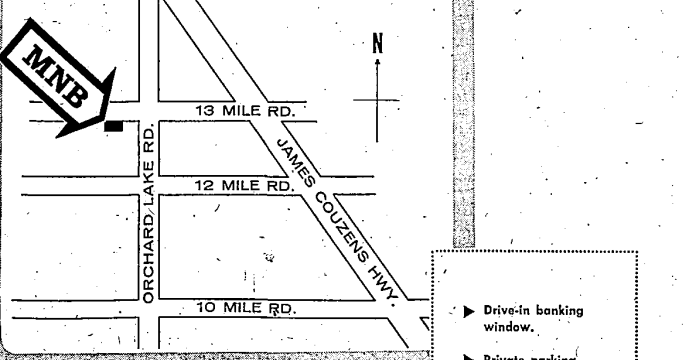
Both Schmalz and Brands, of course, are registered pharmacists. John is married and the father of two children with number three on the way.

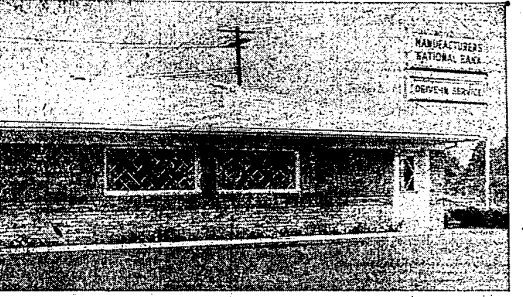
