Expect 10,000 at Sunrise Service

More than 10,000 persons are expected to attend the 10th annual Michigan State Fair Sunrise Service on Sunday, September 4, at 8 a.m. at the Music Shell Amphitheatre. The service will be held in the presence of the Rt. Rev. James A. Pike, Bishop of the Episcopal Diocese of California and will be a program arranged in cooperation with the Detroit Council of Churches. The service is a nationally known preacher, lecturer, author and radio personality. He is considered by many as one of the outstanding religious leaders of the world today. Presiding will be Dr. Joseph L. Roberts, first vice president of the Detroit Council of Churches, and minister of the Bethel A.M.E. Church. Other prominent participants will be Governor G. Mennen Williams, Donald L. Swanson, general manager of the Michigan State Fair, and Dr. G. Merrill Lenox, executive director of the Detroit and Michigan Councils of Churches. Dr. Lenox will introduce the speaker. The invocation will be offered by the Rev. William D. Mercer, minister of Highland Park Trinity Methodist Church. The Scripture will be read by Dr. Ernest W. Dunn, minister of Calvin United Presbyterian Church (East). The prayer will be offered by Dr. S. Lawrence Johnson, minister of the Evangelical Congregational Church, and the benediction will be pronounced by Mr. Carl B. Schock, director of general affairs of the Detroit Council of Churches. A CONCERT of appropriate music will be presented by the Detroit Police concert band, which will play "Music for the Service." Music for the service itself will be provided by the Radio Male Chorus of the Detroit Council of Churches, and by the Nellie Hargett Chorale conducting. Worshipers arriving before the 8 a.m. service will be admitted to the State Fair Grounds free of charge.

Sun. Topic Is 'Christ Jesus'

The vital significance of the life and works of the master Christian will be the central topic of the Lesson-Sermon entitled "Christ Jesus" which will be read at all Christian Science churches Sunday. Scriptural selections will include the following from Luke's gospel (4:41-42): "Now the sun was setting, and all they that had any sickness or diseases brought them unto him; and he laid his hands on every one of them, and healed them. And devils also came out from many, crying out, and saying, Thou art Christ the Son of God. And he rebuking them suffered them not to speak: for he knew that he was Christ." A corroborative passage to be read from "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures" by Mary Baker Eddy includes the following (322:14-15): "The Christ is incorporeal, spiritual, - yet and divine in likeness, dispelling the illusions of the senses; the Way, the Truth, and the Life, healing the sick and casting out evils, destroying sin, disease, and death."

State Leads Nation In New Freeways
Michigan led the nation in the amount of Interstate freeways placed under contract during the first six months of 1960. A report from the U.S. Bureau of Public Roads shows Michigan awarded contracts for construction of 89 miles of Interstate highways between Jan. 1 and June 30. Texas ranked second with 77 miles placed under contract. Followed by California, 65 miles; Missouri, 58 miles; and Illinois, 57 miles.
