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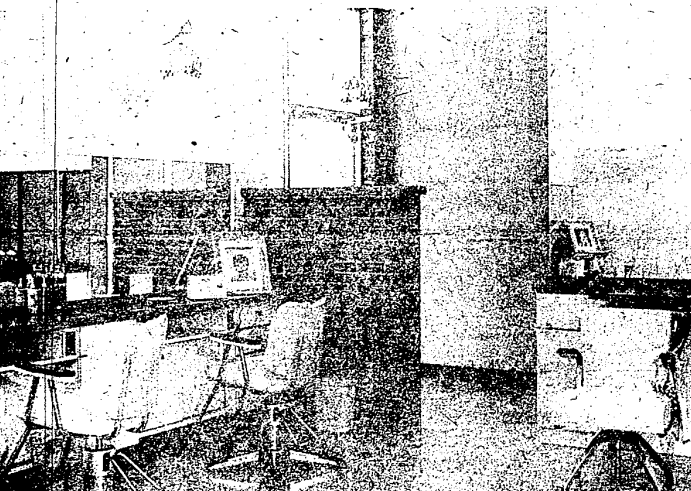

At the present time the spacious parking lot at Kendallwood Center will accommodate 338 cars and when completed it will have 550 spaces for the stores that will make up the total shopping center.

AN UNUSUAL feature in the planning of the shopping center is the fact that the type of stores going into the center have been "hand picked" by residents of the surrounding area.

Long before ground was broken for the first store, a questionnaire was prepared by the developer and sent out to each home in the vicinity asking what types of store the people would like to have. Results of the poll were tabulated and the developers went to work filling the public prescription.

Along with the five new stores just opening their doors, a Fred Sanders store is nearly completed and should be open in a few weeks. The National Bank of Detroit is also constructing an office in the east section of the center which should be open soon.

Among the outstanding features of the Kendallwood Center will be the mall all the way around, enabling customers to walk from one store to another without getting wet on a rainy day; a service road at the rear of the Center for all delivery truck traffic leaving the front section free for customer traffic; and, brick construction in the rear of the stores adding to the overall beauty of the area.

JUST ADJACENT to the center on the east is an ultra-modern \$150,000 medical center housing doctor and dental offices with ample parking available.

A master landscaping plan is now in progress and promises to result in a beautiful array of trees and shrubs to complement the exterior beauty of the development.

Arnold Drug Store, the first establishment completed in Kendallwood Center opened for business in mid-December last year and the Food Fair Super Market opened its doors a month later.

Carl Scott manages the spacious drug store, the 5th to be opened by Arnold Drug Stores Inc. Erwin Wolf serves as assistant manager and head cosmetician is Miss Jean Sinclair.

The 17,000 square foot super market is managed by Gene Karbajinsky. Norman Bembas is the assistant manager.

When the Kendallwood Center is completed there will be from 15 to 18 stores in operation in addition to the doctor and dental offices adjacent to the Center.
