Work Started On Ditch From New High Site

Work is being started this week on a surface water drainage ditch southward from the North Farmington High site on 13 mile just east of Farmington Road, Supt. G. V. Harrison said the Board of Education at its regular meeting Monday night.

The ditch will run southward from the high site for about 1/2 mile approximately 60 feet from the high site, between private properties to an open creek. It was determined earlier that such a drainage ditch would be needed to take away surface water from the school site unless a considerable amount of "fill" dirt was brought in.

Part of the drainage problem in this area will result from the fact that 13 Mile Road is going to be raised considerably above the Oakdale Road. Commission in preparation for the blacktopping of that road way next summer. For this reason the road commission had agreed to at least share in the cost of providing a drainage ditch.

Had an open ditch been dug it would have dug it. But, owners of property adjacent to the route of the proposed ditch objected strongly to such an open ditch. A real estate agent, Edna Briggs, and Barbara Heston, who are practicing in the county road commission, read at the board meeting, indicated that that department would incur the county \$2,000 to the project. The case for the severer arm. Another charge is that the township did not give sufficient notice to the home owners in the area prior to the adoption of a resolution by the Township Board requesting the county to set up a special assessment sewer district.

Another point made by Sirshall was that unfair and confiscatory assessments have been placed on many homeowners in the area who do not have need for the sewer at this time. Many will not even be able to meet payments on the high assessments which have been levied against them, he asserted.
